

## Infectious Disease Reporting Guidelines for Healthcare Providers

WHO?	Any healthcare provider with knowledge of a case or suspect case of a disease which is required by law to reported.
WHAT?	<p>List of reportable diseases: Know Your ABCs: A Quick Guide to Reportable Infectious Diseases in Ohio.</p> <p>Information to include in reports:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Patient Demographics (Name, Address, Phone, DOB, Sex, Race/Ethnicity, Pregnancy status)</li><li>• Disease</li><li>• Method of Diagnosis/Diagnosis Date</li><li>• <b>Date of Illness Onset</b></li><li>• Lab Test Results</li><li>• Signs and Symptoms</li><li>• Treatment</li><li>• Hospital Admission/Discharge Dates</li><li>• Vaccine dates (for applicable disease)</li><li>• Travel/Exposure History</li><li>• Sensitive Settings (school, daycare, food handler, congregate living setting)</li><li>• Healthcare Provider Name, Address, Phone Number</li></ul>
WHEN?	<p>Class A- Report immediately via telephone upon suspicion of disease</p> <p>Class B and C- Fax case reports by the end of the next business day.</p>
WHY?	Reporting of cases of infectious diseases and related conditions has been and remains a vital step in controlling and preventing the spread of communicable disease. These reports are useful in many ways, including assurance of provision of appropriate medical therapy, detection of common-source outbreaks and planning and evaluating prevention and control programs.
HOW?	Call (Class A) or Fax (Class B and C) the local health department in the jurisdiction in which the patient resides. If the place of residence is unknown report to the jurisdiction of the healthcare provider. See regional Ohio health department contacts on back.
